After tasting, it was time for lunch. The Chef, **Shane Valentine**, planned a gourmet fajita bar where everyone made their own fajitas. For dessert, we had Mexican churros and puff pastries with more drinks.

We were also given instructions by our spirit expert on how to make the perfect Margarita! We all enjoyed our Sunday afternoon by the pool relaxing and catching up. Thanks to Shahab and Maurice for pulling this fun and educational event together. 

Does "fall off the bone" describe the best BBQ? Read on to find out the answer.

On a typically hot mid-July Sunday, a string of snakes rumbled into **Barbara and Doug Drummer's** Santa Clara neighborhood for the fifth annual Hot Cars & Hot BBQ.



Cruisers met at Panera Bread for coffee and pastries and then snaked around the South County roads led by **Jim and Carla Kermode**. Lining up the Vipers and taking the group pictures was quick. I think the guests were ready for Arnold Palmers.

As we gathered under the shade of the patio umbrellas, Doug & I put the finishing touches on the meal. Everyone was so busy chatting, I'm not sure they noticed! Doug sliced 50 pounds of brisket, 12 racks of ribs and 5 pounds of German sausage (we had substantial leftovers for the first time). With the smoker at 225 degrees the brisket took 14 hours to reach a level of tenderness that was enjoyable enough to eat so Doug had been up all night. Actually, preparations started six weeks earlier when we purchased the brisket and began aging it. BBQ cuts are from the working part of the animal so they



are tough and require a "low and slow" cooking process. Sliced brisket is from the "flat", fatty "burnt ends" are from the point...we offered both. All agreed they were pretty delish!

Doug's ribs are pretty delicious too so I'm including a picture for your viewing enjoyment.





As is traditional, we wrapped up the meal with a tequila tasting. Sips are small so as to be enjoyable but not so much that we attract unwanted attention when on the road home.

Auto-X: At the Limit of Traction - April 29th

Auto-X (pronounced auto cross) is a competitive event where drivers negotiate a course of traffic cones while one-by-one racing against the clock. This is a perfect opportunity to learn how your car behaves at the limit of traction with few consequences. Enjoy auto-X as a fun social event by racing against your own personal best time or by racing the times logged by your peers. Regardless, any car can compete and everyone is guaranteed a fun, exhilarating time.

The first of two auto-X events for 2017 was held at Marina Municipal Airport near Monterey on April 29th. Thanks to our hosts, our own **Andy Hoepfner** and the Western States Corvette Council (WSCC), all we had to do was show up. Eight club members took part in this event. WSCC set up the track and all that is needed to host a two-day Auto-X event. We participated in two run groups on Sunday that ran the track five times each. The objective is to improve your driving skill so that each run is quicker, no small feat.

Some details about Auto-X...

Everyone must wear a helmet and loaners are available onsite. Passengers are generally welcome in any car, just ask. Everyone who drives must pay back the club by performing the duties of a course worker. This means you will be assigned a location on the track where you will stand for the full 2-hour session while watching for violations like moving a cone. Even this can be a learning experience.

Plan to join our future Auto-X event, we promise you will have a really fun time.

Hoosiers, Gyrodiscs and Margaritas – Thunderhill Raceway September 16-17th

Seven Vipers gathered at Thunderhill Raceway for a weekend of tracking and fun. I will let the pictures do

most of the talking, but a few technical things I'd like to share:

Girodisc Rotors and Raybestos ST43 pads: After a couple of years of tracking on the OEM CCM carbon brakes, the rotors were worn out. They were flawless in performance, but went from pads lasting 4+ days in the front to just 1-1/2 days so it was time to try something new. I sprung for the Girodisc iron conversion set up. They were fantastic and pad wear was minimal (I need to take a measurement, but they look nearly new). My priority is to make tracking more economical and the replacement pads are reasonable, so this is a big step in the right direction.



Hoosier R7s: Tracy, a fellow ACR Extreme owner, came all the way from Washington with his lady Jody to track with us. Tracy graciously offered to let me borrow his front Hoosier R7s for a session. He had run them for 3 days (probably 15 sessions), and they were still soft to the fingernail. To my pleasant surprise,



lap times were nearly as good as with the Kumhos, despite the session being hotter. The ride height in the front was too high as well, due to the Hoosier's 1+ inch greater height. Feel was fantastic regardless, no complaints about the Hoosiers. I think I'll get about 4 days out of the Hoosiers vs. only 1 day out of my front Kumhos. Just bought a frontrear R7 set, 295/30-19s and 345/30-19s. In mid-October, I'll be heading to Buttonwillow Raceway to do a full Hoosier/Girodisc weekend. I just recalibrated ride height, cornerweighted and aligned it to

compensate for the Hoosiers. I'll keep you posted how they do.

Ok enough talking, I'll let the pictures tell the story. We tracked with a bunch of Porsches, modded Corvettes and other fast machines. The ACRs once again held their own and were the classiest of the field.

Saturday eve, we enjoyed a round of margaritas compliments of Jim, who brought his brand spanking new Competition Blue ACR.
